Annual Business Meeting Outcomes

October 2018, Cleveland, OH

- Rule change increasing annual dues by 15%
 - Designed to offset increased cost for resources, marketing, trainings and attendance of the annual MIC3 business meeting (previous rate set in 2009)
 - West Virginia's increase is \$300, for a total of \$2,300
- Rule change requiring annual State Council meetings in every state
 - Referrals made to the compliance committee when a meeting is not held and an agenda with minutes are not received
 - In response to ten states having not held a meeting of their state council in the last two fiscal years



West Virginia Update

MIC3 Inquiries Received in WV FY 2019

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Qualifying Cases

- Service member relocating to WV on active duty orders
- Inquiring about out-of-district enrollment (other than in the county they would be moving to), which is not a provision covered in the Compact
- Inquiring about provisions for the transfer of credits which are not yet completed, which is not covered in the Compact (timing can be an issue)
- Provided county-specific and MIC3 related information about enrollment and out-of-state credit conversion


What is the Compact?

The Military Interstate Children's Compact was developed in 2006 and adopted by all 50 states, the District of Columbia and the Department of Defense Education Activity. The Compact eases the educational challenges that military children encounter, and supports uniform treatment as they transfer between school districts in member states.

The Compact only applies to public schools.



MILITARY INTERSTATE CHILDREN'S COMPACT COMMISSION





Students Covered – Children of the following:

- Active duty members of the uniformed services, including members of the National Guard and Reserve on active duty orders (Title 10)
- Members or veterans who are medically discharged or retired for one year
- Members who die on active duty, for a period of one year after death
- Uniformed members of the Commissioned Corps of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), and United States Public Health Services (USPHS)

Students Not Covered- Children of the following:

- Inactive members of the National Guard and Reserves (Not Title 10)
- Members now retired not covered above
- Veterans not covered above
- Other Department of Defense personnel, federal agency civilians and contract employees not defined as active duty
- Members other than the uniformed personnel of NOAA and USPHS



Importance of Compact Participation in WV

- Ensures schools and school districts **in WV** make reasonable accommodations for military families and children from other states.
- Ensures schools and school districts in states other than WV make reasonable accommodations for military families and children from WV.
- Ensures children of parents who serve are impacted to the least extent possible and offered similar opportunities in every state:
 - Prompt enrollment and placement in classes (immunizations and school records)
 - Adequate credits for classes previously taken and graduation (ex. state history)
 - IEPs ready for immediate use
 - Excusing necessary absences, related to deployment
 - Flexibility for participation in extracurricular activities (ex. application deadlines)
- Impacts readiness and mobility for addressing major and/or catastrophic events.

Quick Facts

Compact Quick Fact Guide

Goal of the Compact

To overcome transitional issues experienced by military families when their children move to a new school in another state.

Member States

All states and the District of Columbia.

Applies to

Active duty members of uniformed services including the National Guard and Reserve members on active duty orders pursuant to 10 U.S.C. §1209 and 1211, as well as veterans who are severely injured and medically discharged for one year after medical discharge or retirement, and veterans who die on active duty for a period of one year after death.

Educational Records

Receiving member states must accept unofficial records for initial enrollment and then the sending member state must submit official records within 10 days of receipt of the request for records.

Immunizations

A child who is unable to provide official documented proof of at least one dose of each required vaccination must be automatically enrolled and/or homebound services will be provided within 3 days, to ensure educational services are immediately provided while the first dose(s) of all required immunizations are confirmed. Note: Tuberculosis testing is currently not required for enrollment in WV schools.

Kindergarten and 1st Grade Entrance Age

A student who moves may continue in the same grade in the receiving state regardless of the entrance age requirements of the receiving state.

Course and Educational Program Placement

School districts must initially honor equivalent course enrollment or program placement (ex. Gifted, AP, etc.), if available. Then, evaluation may occur to ensure appropriate placement. Space must be available, and member states must demonstrate reasonable accommodations.

Special Education

Receiving schools must use the sending state's IEP until a new IEP may be conducted/ evaluated.

Placement Flexibility

The Compact encourages schools to waive course prerequisites as appropriate to the content, when similar coursework was completed (ex. Requirement to pass Geometry before taking Algebra).

Absence Related to Deployment

The Compact establishes guidelines for enhanced flexibility with excused absences for military families on active duty orders (one month before deployment and six months after return).

Enrollment

During deployments it may be necessary for students to stay with a non-custodial parent or someone in loco parentis. Guardianship of a student under these circumstances should not prevent or negatively impact enrollment (a power of attorney is sufficient). The family may keep their school as long as the guardian provides transportation.

Extracurricular Participation

Deadlines for application are not grounds for disqualification. The school must demonstrate reasonable accommodation, but is not required to hold open or create additional space on teams.

Course Waivers

Substituting equivalent coursework is required (ex. West Virginia History for Ohio History). Reasonable justification is required for denial of a course waiver.

Transfers as a Senior in High School

The receiving state works with the sending school district to issue a diploma, if the student is a senior in High School (ex. using a memorandum of understanding between schools).
