- Attend high school in West Virginia and plan to be in attendance next year
- A resident of West Virginia
- A junior at the time of application
- Must not graduate before January 2026
- Have a grade-point average of at least 3.5 or be in top 10% of class
- No transcribed grades below a C
- Must satisfy all immunization requirements set by the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources (DHHR). Nonpublic school and homeschool students must provide proof of immunizations.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Achieve a composite score at or above the 90th percentile on the PSAT, SAT, or another standardized test OR
- A score of three (3) or higher on an AP exam

General Information

- The state deadline for applications from the county superintendent is Friday, March 28, 2025. The school and county will have established deadlines to provide time for review of applications before making selections and sending their recommendations to the WVDE. Please check with the school counselor or principal to determine the deadline to submit Part II.
- Part II of the application (this form and all supporting documents as required within the application) are submitted directly to the school counselor.
- Copies of transcripts and standardized testing reports are required with the application. These documents will need to be provided by the school counselor.
- Within the application, you will be required to secure <u>one teacher recommendation</u>. Please provide sufficient notice to your teacher prior to submitting the application.

2025 GHA Theme: Appalachia Envisioned

During the 2025 West Virginia Governor's Honor's Academy (GHA) at West Virginia University, you will participate in academic and extracurricular activities that explore this year's theme: Appalachia Envisioned. Through this topic, you will investigate and imagine what West Virginia and the region will be in the far future. As young scholars, you will envision that future through a sustainability lens, one that pertains to your generation and future world. Imagining a society and a West Virginia that honors the past and its culture as it adapts, progresses, and becomes more incorporated into the larger global community.

As a member of Generation Z, you will have the opportunity to lead, chart, and help shape the world we now live in. During your GHA experience you will have a chance to explore and research such state-wide and global issues concerning technology innovations, climate change challenges, growing political strife and social divide, socioeconomic uncertainties, and intensifying social justice movements to name a few. The 2025 GHA theme will enable you to better understand how we got to where we are so you may better contend with the world you will inherit, and create a new world that you would like to live in.

Programming will enable you to explore the above-mentioned themes as they pertain to critical historical and contemporary realities in your community, our state, nationally, and at the global level. Your GHA experience will allow you to define what aspects of our shared past you wish to keep and revitalize in the future and which elements are best left behind.

Write a short essay (300-350 words) convincing the reader of the importance of being a responsible citizen in our world. You may include several examples of what you see as issues facing our state, domestic and global communities. Your essay must be completely formatted in a Word document using 12 Times New Roman and double spaced.

The following criteria will be used to evaluate your writing:

- Organization and content
- Strong topic sentence supporting the thesis.
- Points are well organized and well developed.
- Includes sufficient details to defend positions.
- The use of thoughtful vocabulary
- The use of a variety of sentence types

The school counselor will scan all documents into one file for each student application.

A selection committee at the school will determine students who are recommended from each school. Students who are selected will be recommended to the county superintendent for final selections.

The West Virginia Department of Education is not accepting paper submissions of applications. Once the counselor has scanned all required documents into one file for each student, those files will be submitted electronically from the school to the county and then uploaded to the state file submission from the county superintendent's recommendations. The county contact uploads the county selections to the file submission.
